



I have recently joined USS The Sulivans Association. This is a dual ship organization, DD537 and DDG68.. Both ships carry that name I served 2 years on DD537 as a member of the select reserve crew Those were good times. Every month the ship would dock in the Brooklyn Navy Yard to pick us up for a weekend training cruise. Entering and leaving New York harbor was very different from leaving the destroyer piers in Norfolk . The New York harbor is truly huge. Ferries or other ships there were no problem Each August we would spend 2 weeks on active duty.

One trip north to St John Nova Scotia was memorable. There was constant fog in the area north of Maine and I lost my voice. Something about that fog affected my vocal chords and I was relieved of duties for several days. On the return trip I had the midwatch and picked up a sonar contact. It was as big and clear as it could be. I reported it, but hesitated with the classification . We passed the target and came back several times before the bridge demanded a classification. Possible submarine was the only choice. Calling it in, the ship went to GQ. We circled the target some more and tracked it for several hours before reporting it on to COMLANT.

The target seemed dead in the water from tracking with our fathometer, but tracking accuracy was not that good. A flight of P3 Orions came in that morning and reported MADMAN. They had found a metallic object. There were no reports on the SOSUS net, but it still looked suspicious. I think some more ships came in, possibvly Canadian. We were relived after several more hours and secured for lunch or possibly supper. I am sure that many comments were made about stupid Sonarmen. The contact was later identified as a sunken wreck and placed on the official charts.


I hope to make the Field day for The Sullivans in August. I'm not sure what someone my age can contribute, but I will give it a try.
