SECTION 2: To promote the bond of friendship between all of the crew members who served in her during the years of commissioned service through newsletters, web site, Internet, and reunions..

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

PRESIDENTS CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

Good day to all my shipmates and to all those serving, who have served and those who will serve our great country in the United States military. I'm writing this on Veteran's Day which I thought appropriate and am amazed by the wonderful outpouring of recognition the veterans are receiving. It was quite different for many of us in the 60s when we returned from our service and it seemed an unpopular thing to recognize anyone who served or was serving. I'm grateful to see that things have changed. Thanks to all of you for what you did in serving our country.

We were speaking of our service in the military the other day and someone asked me if I went to Vietnam. I responded that I hadn't and he kind of blew it off as though I hadn't done anything. To which I responded to this person who "had done nothing" and never served that I had left my home on April 10, 1967 and didn't return until February 10, 1969 (with the exception of a 5 day leave to come home and be the best man in my brother's wedding). I explained that even though nobody was shooting at me, I did the job the Navy sent me to do and did it to the best of my ability. I was gone from my home for almost 2 years of my life; I was earning about \$5000 a year working when I left, for a job that paid me about \$800 a year with absolutely no financial help from anywhere else. I explained that serving is sacrifice in many ways, a check that we write up to and including our very lives. I do not regret or begrudge those two years one bit; what I do begrudge is someone who thinks less of anyone's service just because they didn't get shot – particularly from someone who never served himself. All of us served in the manner in which our government ordered and all of us should stand proud. Every job needs to be filled in order for us to have the freedoms we enjoy.

The upcoming reunion is getting closer and is less than a year away now. There are reservation forms in this issue that you can print and complete and mail to me between now and then. The sooner the better. As we get closer I will be putting our reunion notices in the appropriate magazines and papers to try and reach everyone who served aboard the OWENS. I view this as an excellent opportunity to gain new members and possibly "reup" some former ones. We can make our hotel reservations now (don't have to pay until then) and have 25 rooms reserved; beyond that it's strictly what's available. Bobby Williams and I have reviewed all the information, forms, trips, hotel, etc. and are quite confident that this will be a great reunion with something for us all.

As we get closer to the reunion and the notices go into the papers and magazines I'm sure I'll be swamped with emails and calls from all sorts of vendors wanting to provide a "free" service for us. Nothing's free. I've already had some vendors emailing offering their free services in order to sell their product to all of us individually – photos, nick-naks, transportation, etc. I've turned them all down. My experience is that they turn into more than a nuisance and take up more of our time than necessary. I don't blame them, I just don't want them. This is our time – not theirs.

I have to send out kudos to Ed Greene, our treasurer, who keeps close tabs on our finances, collects our dues, pays our donations for memorials, and forwards our financial information to the board every month for scrutiny. Someone contacted Ed the other day and told him that Larry wanted him to send \$3450 immediately to them for expenses incurred. Ed immediately called me, did not send anything, and verified it was a hoax. This is the kind of person I want guarding our money!! Thanks Ed, great job. Which brings up another point, make sure your dues are up to date. If you don't know, contact Ed and see where you are. (I need to do that now.)

REUNION INFORMATION & UPDATES

The reunion committee has been busy scheduling the next reunion in 2019 and we have finalized the hotel and day-trips. In keeping with the wishes of the organization we're having it during the week and not over a weekend and we have moved it three weeks away from the Labor Day weekend. We certainly hope this gives more encouragement to attend by all our members. Here's a list of the information as follows:

REUNION DATES: September 30 to October 4, 2019. We'll check-in on Monday, 9/30, side trips on Tuesday and Wednesday 10/1-2, business meeting and banquet on Thursday, 10/3 and check-out from the hotel on Friday 10/4. Of course, you can come early and stay late if you want, just let the hotel know the extra dates. But be advised, there is a significant increase in the room rates for Friday and Saturday. You may make your reservations now by calling the hotel or by submitting the enclosed reservation form. The group code is: USSROA. The room rates are displayed at the top of the reservation form. As of now the hotel has reserved 25 rooms for us; if we don't fill them all we have no obligation to pay for the remainder. Make your reservations now; 25 rooms will go quickly.

SIDE TRIPS: We have two trips scheduled. Tuesday, 10/1, we will be doing the Patriots Point w/ Lunch in the CPO Lounge on the USS YORKTOWN. This trip includes the transportation, guides and lunch and is \$65 per person. The "Day in Historic Charleston Tour" on Wednesday includes transportation, tour guide and we will be on our own for lunch in the Old City Market where we can eat and shop. The cost for this trip is \$40 per person. (See the Tour & Event reservation sheet)

BANQUET: Our banquet will be a buffet style dinner held in Salons B, C, and D on Thursday evening at 6:00 p.m. A guarantee of 40 or more people is required. The cost is \$45 per person. The menu is:

MEETING, BANQUET AND HOSPITALITY ROOMS: To get a feel of where our rooms are located, please go to the hotel's web site or view a layout of the property on the attached page. Our banquet is in Salons B, C, and D, and our hospitality room is Salon A. There is adequate room in each for our needs. In order for these rooms to be complimentary, we need to fill an average of 15 paid guest rooms per night. Otherwise, the organization will be charged for the rooms.

As you can see, most of the things we do depend on the membership supporting the reunion. The costs of our trips is based on a minimum of 35 people participating and the cost of the banquet is based on a minimum of 40 persons in attendance. The reunion committee has done it's best to control the prices of the trips, banquet, etc. When we think of the costs, we have to remember for the trips it includes transportation in a nice, air-conditioned tour bus with driver provided, tour guides, some food, the cost of the tours and the charge for the tour company. For the banquet, it's the food, wait staff, gratuity, tax, 3 banquet rooms; and somewhere we have to remember the "free" hospitality room. Bottom line, it costs to have fun, so don't let the prices deter you from attending. Nothing we do is mandatory so you are not obligated to participate in everything; but the committee feels as though each item is a good value compared to anything or anywhere else.

We cannot stress attendance enough. The reunion is less than a year away and each of us has time to budget and plan. We only do this once every other year, so please plan to attend and make this a memorable reunion.

The reunion committee, Bobby Williams and Larry McCoskey, has worked together to establish a reservation form and a price guide for all trips and the banquet and it is printed in this issue of the PING. At this time please begin to make reservations and submit your checks for the activities you choose. We have established a cut-off date of August 15, 2019, as the hotel and tour companies require advance down payments 30 days out. This also gives Bobby and Larry time to make name tags, put together welcome packages, etc. **However, remember that the hotel reservations must be made separately with the hotel.**

Any updates or changes will be posted immediately on the website pages designated for the 2019 Reunion and if major changes are made, USPS notifications will be sent out as well.
