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

Reunion Information & Updates

Reunion Dates—October 4, 2021 to October 8, 2021. We'll check in on Monday 10/4, with side trips on Tuesday 10/5, and Wednesday 10/6. The business meeting and banquet will be on Thursday 10/7, with check out Friday morning on 10/8. I'm planning a side trip for the ladies on Thursday, while we're having our business meeting. If you'd like, you can arrive up to 2 days early, or stay up to 2 days later, to explore the city. The hotel has offered the same room rate if anyone decides to do so. The room rate is \$72.00 + 14% tax per night. Let the hotel

The hotel has blocked 25 rooms for us, but we are under no obligation to fill 25 rooms. Please make your reservations as soon as possible. If you are calling the hotel to make your reservations, tell them you're with "The Owens Ship Reunion". Give them the dates and they'll be able to pull it up on the computer. If you have any special room requests, make the hotel aware of them, i.e., handicapped accessible, etc. They can't guarantee they'll be able to accommodate your request, but every effort will be made if they can.

<u>Side Trips—</u>There are two trips scheduled for the group and possibly a trip for the ladies. On Tuesday 10/5, we'll travel to the Flight 93 National Memorial in Shanksville and then have lunch at the American Legion in Stoystown. The cost for this trip is \$45 per person. On Wednesday 10/6, we're planning a "Day in the 'Burgh". We'll be picked up at the hotel on a trolley and given a guided tour through the various districts of the city, a ride on the Duquesne Incline and lunch at Station Square "on our own". We'll be picked back up at Station Square and taken to Soldiers & Sailor's Memorial Hall for a guided tour and then returned to the hotel. The cost for this trip is \$70 per person. On Thursday 10/7, we're planning a guided tour for the ladies to Phipps Conservatory, while we have our business meeting. The cost for this guided tour is \$55 per person.

Banquet—At this time the banquet will be a buffet style dinner, Thursday evening at 6PM. However, there may be meal restrictions when we have our banquet, so we have to be flexible. There will be a cash bar right outside the ballroom. The cost for dinner will be \$35 per person, which includes tax & gratuity. The menu includes:

Reunion Information & Updates Continued

<u>In Summary</u> - As with all the reunions in the past, the cost for the items shown are based on attendance. I've used 25 as the number of attendees, however the side trip for the ladies on Thursday, to Phipps Conservatory, is based upon 10. If we don't get 10, we'll cancel the trip, however a smaller group could go in private vehicles and save the transportation fee, which is \$35 per person. If you'd like to check out their website, to see if you'd be interested, the website is <u>www.phipps.conservatory.org</u>.

We have a local transportation company which has 28 & 40 passenger buses, as well as the standard 56. I've priced our transportation on Wednesday, using the 28-passenger bus, but if we have to step up to the 40, we can. Due to the pandemic, the first trolley company I was working with has gone out of business. Luckily, I was able to find another trolley company, Molly's Trolleys, that can accommodate us.

When it comes to the tours, I tried to pick things that would appeal to the whole group, but by no means is that all there is to do while you're here. You can tour the city on the water using the Gateway Clipper, which is a river paddle wheeler, or go to Mt Washington to enjoy the panoramic views of the city on the lookouts, and/or enjoy one of the 4, or 5, star restaurants, or have dinner at the Grand Concourse Restaurant in Station Square, or tour the Heinz History Center, or go to one of the two casinos in the area; not to mention the local restaurants and attractions in the area, where you'll be staying. Most of the upscale restaurants require reservations and business casual attire.

At the beginning of October, the leaves usually start to change. I'm hoping we'll be able to enjoy some eye-candy during the bus ride up and back from the Flight 93 Memorial. As you know, 2021 will be the 20th anniversary of the attack. I assume the National Park Service will be providing some type of special event, but I don't know if they'll be providing a presentation when we attend. I will continue to reach out to the National Park Service, to see what can be arranged.

I hope by keeping the cost for the rooms below \$100 a night and the cost for the reunion almost the same as it was in Charleston, 2 years ago, you'll be able to fit it into your budget. If you have any questions, or want me to forward website addresses, so you can check things out, please reach out to me. 2021 Ship's Reunion Details

It's that time folks! Time to start making your reservations for our reunion in October. I recently received my 2nd shot, courtesy of the VA and I'm assuming most of you have gotten yours as well.

Back in January we sent a letter to the shipmates with email addresses, providing an update on what I had been working on since the Winter Ping. A lot of what I'm about to share will be the same, but some will be different.

For Monday—It is check in day at the Comfort Inn at 699 Rodi Road, Pittsburgh (Penn Hills), PA 15235. If you're flying into Pittsburgh. We have 2 airports. Most of the major airlines fly in and out of Pittsburgh International Airport, but being the largest airport, it's in an area that isn't close to the city. Our hotel is on the opposite end of the county, about an hour away, and **does not** offer shuttle service. You'll need to get an Uber, a taxi, or rent a car. I would suggest renting a car.

The other airport in the area is the Arnold Palmer Airport. It's in Latrobe, which is east of the hotel. I know Spirit has direct flights from Orlando, Myrtle Beach and a couple other cities. Again, our hotel **does not** offer shuttle service and you'll need to get an Uber, a taxi, or rent a car. I'm going to suggest renting a car, but because the airport is east of the hotel, you won't have to travel through the city and negotiate 2 tunnels to get to the hotel. It's a less hectic ride from the smaller airport.

<u>For Tuesday—</u>I sent an email to the National Park Service, asking if we could have a Ranger board our bus, to explain the various items throughout the park, before we disembark to tour the facility and visitors center, on our own. I haven't heard from them, and quite honestly, I don't expect to. This year will be the 20th anniversary of the attack, so I'm sure there are events and ceremonies being planned. The last time I was there, we were able to park and walk around the area at our leisure. I'm sure we'll be able to do the same, even though we'll be on a bus.

Also, I was able to touch base with the Assistant Steward/Bar Manager at the American Legion in Stoystown. She has planned a 2-option hot lunch, with a cold salad and one non-alcoholic beverage, cost is \$10 per person, with tax & gratuity included.

For Wednesday—As most of you know, I was having issues with the trolley company and wasn't able to complete the itinerary in time for the Winter Ping. I found out they went out of business and I had to find a replacement. I was able to receive a contract from Molly's Trolleys to be our mode of transportation. They're a little more expensive, but they're able to accommodate us. They'll pick us up at the hotel and take us on a guided tour of the city. The tour includes a ride on the Duquesne Incline. (The Duquesne Incline is the red trolley in the panoramic view of Pittsburgh.) We'll be dropped at Station Square for lunch on our own*. Before the pandemic there were numerous restaurants to choose from. We'll be picked up from lunch and taken to the Soldiers & Sailor's Memorial Hall for a guided tour. At the end of the tour, we'll be returned to the hotel.
*I was hoping we would have lunch at Primanti Brother's, a Pittsburgh original, but I haven't been able to finalize that yet; though it

*I was hoping we would have lunch at Primanti Brother's, a Pittsburgh original, but I haven't been able to finalize that yet; though it may still happen. They're known for putting the meat, fries and coleslaw, between thick Italian bread and serving it stacked.

<u>For Thursday</u>—While we have our business meeting is in the morning, the ladies are scheduled to tour Phipps Conservatory. The cost for a guided tour is \$20 per person and the transportation is \$35. If 10 ladies aren't interested, we won't rent the van. If a few ladies are interested in going, you can drive there. It's approx. 20 minutes from the hotel. I've arranged for lunch to be served after the meeting. We're planning to Zoom the business meeting, which is a first for our organization. Jerry Jackson is coordinating the effort and will address it later in the Ping. The banquet will be held in the Seasons Ballroom that evening, with a guest speaker.

<u>And Finally—</u>If nothing else, the pandemic has taught us we need to be patient and allow for flexibility. While I've done my best to nail things down, some things are out of my control, while others are still being finished. For instance, right now buffet meals aren't permitted, but sit-down meals are. That means we may have a served meal, instead of a buffet meal. It will be the same meal, but served differently.

When it comes to accessibility, I have 2 folding wheelchairs and a lightweight aluminum walker, should anyone need them. At the present time, masks are still required in PA, but as more people receive their vaccines, I believe restrictions will be lifting. I hope you're keeping October 4th thru 8th open, to come and enjoy the camaraderie. Remember, the hotel will honor the rate up to 2 days prior and after the reunion. I look forward to seeing everyone

LAST CIVIL WAR PENSIONER DIES

The last person to receive a pension from the Civil War died May 31, 2020. Irene Triplett, 90, received \$877.56 each year (\$73.13 per month) from the Department of Veterans Affairs. "The jaw-dropping fact that someone in the year 2020 was still earning a Civil War pension was the result of two factors," according to the Washington Post. "First, Triplett suffered cognitive impairments, qualifying her for the lifelong penstion as a helpless adult child of a veteran. Second, her father Mose Triplett, who'd served as a private in the Confederate Army before defecting to the Union, was on his second marriate when she was born in 1930. He was just a few weeks away from turning 84".

Mose Triplett joined the Confederate army in 1862, serving in a North carolina regiment. He defected to the Union in June 1863, after contracting a fever and being admitted to a hospital in Danville, Va. The Post points out that his switch to the Union side was fortunate timing. Barely a week after defecting, 734 of the 800 men in his former Confederate regiment died at the Battle of Gettysburg.

The Post notes that there are 33 spouses and 18 children who still receive VA benefits related to the Spanish-American War, fought in 1898.

A VIRTUAL REUNION BUSINESS MEETING

Have you ever thought to yourself, "I would love to attend the Associations business meetings so I could be involved but can't make it this year?".

I have but until now there really hasn't been the method or opportunity to do so. However, that changes this year. We will be having a Zoom Virtual Business Meeting so that more members can at least observe and be aware of what transpires at the business meeting. Here is what is going to happen....

At 0900 hours EST on October 7th, 2021 in Pittsburg, President Larry McCoskey will call the Association Biennial Business meeting to order. Generally the meetings begin with the pledge of Allegiance followed by the Prayer by the Association Chaplain. Because of the limited time that is allowed by us on Zoom, outside (virtual attendees) members will not be present, but approximately at 09:10 hour, the Zoom meeting will kick in and invitees will be able to attend.

As I am limited to 100 people at a time to be virtually present, the first 100 people that click in at the beginning of the time announced will be able to sign in and attend. The balance of the people attempting to sign in will be assigned to the "waiting room" and as people drop out of the meeting, the next person in the queue will be advised that they can enter the event.

Now that I have you completely confused, lets go over what a zoom virtual meeting is. At the Pittsburg end, there will be a computer with a projector attached that will show the screen view on a large movie screen. They will be the "host" computer and their camera will point at the group attending in person at the meeting. I will have sent out an "invitation" to all those that want to attend through their computers (virtual attendees) and the invitation will give you a <u>time</u> and <u>date</u> that the meeting will take place. There will also be a <u>web site listed</u> as well as a user code and password.

At the exact date and time (EST – so convert to your time to know when), you will be able to just click on the web site that is listed and it will automatically put you into the meeting. If you are not in the first 100 people to click in, it will advise you that you are in the "waiting room" and all you can do is to wait until someone leaves for you to enter. Sorry, zoom rules not mine.

You will be able to hear and see what is going on as the meeting will be the primary picture **however** you will NOT be able to talk and be heard by anyone. The reason is that your microphones would pick up 100 peoples pets barking, grandkids yelling, toilet flushing, and the hundred other household noises that would totally destroy the meeting at the other end. We are looking into a way for you to interact and silently vote (as long as the by-laws allow) but that will come in the summer version of the PING as we are still looking into things.

This notice is to advance warn everyone what we are trying as a break through in meeting attendance and participation. This is about the only good thing that has come from the Covid Wuhan Virus, a means for people to communicate and participate from afar.

For the moment you do not need to do anything. You are free to send me your name if you would like to be included (invited) to the meeting and I am sure you have questions and I will be glad to answer them if I can. I will be the scheduler for this meeting so your invite will come from me and I will be controlling the waiting room as well. Let me hear from you soon.
